Starting in 2019, Homage and MultiCare's Celebrate Seniority Program have partnered to better serve the south King County elder community with the Senior Companion Program.

Mary Ann Higgins coordinates the program for Homage – the AmeriCorps Seniors Grantee – for both Snohomish County and King County.

Deborah Gurney is the MultiCare Celebrate Seniority Station Supervisor – for the south King County based Senior Companion Volunteers.



The Homage Senior Companion Program (SCP):



- National Service Program
- Federally Funded by AmeriCorps Seniors and local match
- An opportunity for lower income volunteers 55+ to serve others in their communities by helping older adults live in their homes longer and improve their quality of life.
- Currently we have 8 SCP Volunteers serving in south King County



Senior Companion Volunteers offer to those 60+ or adults with disabilities:

- Companionship in home or in the community (socialize, play cards, take walks, accompany to senior centers or other community locations)
- Some offer transportation assistance
- Shopping assistance
- Enjoy meal together
- Assistance with home organizing
- Spends time with client to offer respite to family caregiver
 - Not allowed to do housecleaning or personal care





To Be an SCP Volunteer, must be:

- Age 55+
- Mthly income under \$2430
- Willing to serve at least 6-8+ hrs/week
- Pass background checks, complete 20 hrs pre-service orientation
- Attend monthly zoom or in-person meetings
- Enjoy helping others

Volunteers receive \$4/hr stipend & mileage reimbursements

Deb - Client eligibility:



- Be age 60+ or an adult with a disability
- Be isolated or have a health issue that makes it hard to get out of home; would benefit from more social interaction.
- Live in King or Snohomish Counties
- No income requirements free to all clients
- Live in their own home or apt (not in AFH or Assisted Living)
- Have a family caregiver who needs respite
- Safe home for volunteer to visit

Refer clients to get on waitlist – wait depends on where they liveor be open to weekly social phone calls
